Reference: Amended North American Electric Reliability Corporation Bylaws

On October 14, 2020, North American Electric Reliability Corporation (NERC) submitted proposed amendments to the NERC Bylaws. NERC states that the proposed amendments (1) address governance matters relating to the composition of NERC's membership sectors, certain rules relating to the Member Representatives Committee, as well as the qualification of independent trustees for the NERC Board of Trustees; (2) update certain provisions to conform with applicable state law; and (3) improve internal consistency and introduce ministerial changes within the NERC Bylaws with respect to capitalizing defined terms consistently and removing inoperative provisions.

Notice of this filing was published in the *Federal Register*, with protests and interventions due on or before November 4, 2020. Notices of intervention and unopposed timely filed motions to intervene are granted pursuant to the operation of Rule 214 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure. 18 C.F.R. § 385.214. No adverse comments were received.

NERC's uncontested filing is accepted pursuant to the relevant authority delegated to the Director, Office of Energy Market Regulation, under 18 C.F.R. § 375.307.

This action shall not be construed as approving any other application, including proposed revisions of Electric Reliability Organization or Regional Entity rules or procedures pursuant to 18 C.F.R. § 375.307(a)(2)(vi). This action does not constitute approval of any service, rate, charge, classification, or any rule, regulation, contract, or practice affecting such rate or service provided for in the filed documents. Such action shall not be deemed as recognition of any claimed right or obligation associated therewith.
