### PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

This seminar, led by Balch & Bingham attorneys, will include candid presentations and panel discussions by seasoned attorneys from a wide variety of backgrounds and career paths who will offer their perspectives on how students can enhance their academic and professional success and make the most of law school opportunities. ### ELIGIBILITY AND SELECTION CRITERIA

All incoming first-year law students are eligible to apply, although the focus of the seminar is on students who are minorities, are low-income, speak English as a second language, attended secondary school in a Title I district, are first-generation college students, or have resided in a public housing facility. The Boot Camp is limited to approximately 50 students.

Selected participants will be notified when their applications are received and approved. A stipend is available to help offset travel costs to the program for students who are joining us from out of state. To be considered for a travel stipend, please complete the "Travel Stipend Request Form" included with the application.
